IDES COVID-19 Appeal Letter

Dear Friends,

I hope you and your loved ones are well. I know the past few months have been full of uncertainty, and there have been many changes to your usual routines. In the 47-year history of IDES, we have never faced a global disaster of this magnitude. The COVID -19 pandemic is an event that has, or soon will, affect everyone on the planet.

As the virus has afflicted nation after nation, IDES' mission partners on the front lines of this battle are asking for help. In week 14 of this year, about 80% of the project proposals we received were related to the pandemic. In week 15, the number rose to 100%.

Here are summaries of just a few COVID-19 projects IDES has funded over the past two weeks:

• In the Dominican Republic, IDES is helping a partner mission provide baskets of essential food & sanitation items to families where breadwinners

are unable to work due to government ordered business closures. (More than 8,500 people were helped)

- In Honduras, IDES is assisting a mission partner with the purchase of personal protective equipment (masks, gloves, gowns, goggles, digital thermometers) so they can continue to operate a medical clinic serving the needs of the urban poor. (About 1,000 people served)
- In the border region of Kenya and Tanzania a partner mission operates several clinics. IDES is helping provide personal protective equipment, medications, and supplies to protect both staff and patients as they continue to serve in Christ's name during this turbulent time.
- IDES is helping a Christian ministry in the Midwest produce up to 50,000 medical grade masks by the end of May. The masks are being donated to U.S. hospitals, health care workers, ambulance crews, fire fighters, law enforcement and first responders.
- Elsewhere in the U.S. IDES has provided financial assistance to food pantries operated by partnering churches in CA, NY, KY & TN where COVID-19 related unemployment has caused the need for hunger relief services to spike.

In the final week before Indiana residents came under "Work from Home" restrictions, a group of IDES staff and family members packed and distributed over 3,700 GAP meals

through a food assistance program to families of students experiencing food insecurity.

As more and more countries go into "lock-down" mode due to COVID-19, the plight of the poor continues to worsen. IDES is receiving daily requests from mission partners in countries where people are not allowed to travel outside their neighborhoods, or where work opportunities are dwindling due to the virus. Beyond medical needs, one of the most immediate effects of the pandemic is an upsurge in the number of people battling acute hunger.

In the U.S. many families are able to stock up on food supplies that may last several weeks. But in nations where abject poverty is widespread, many people must work today or they will have nothing to eat tomorrow. They urgently need our help.

As IDES and our global partners continue to care for those affected by this outbreak, we also need your help. Please partner with us both financially and prayerfully. A gift of any amount will be used 100% to meet needs related to the COVID-19 crisis. We thank you in advance for your compassion and your generosity.

In this uncertain world, let us remember, we serve a God who from the dawn of creation has been creating order out of chaos, and bringing His peace into the midst of life's raging storms.

May God bless you with peace and safety, and may we live our lives to His glory,


