



FALLING LEAVES

When you can crunch leaves and when you can hear the crunch of football pads on TV again it must be fall. The air gets a little crisper and you can smell the cold, the bonfires, and the allergens. What really strikes a chord with me and thinking of fall is the changing of colors. Trees with leaves go from green to a different colorful array. However, those new colors don't stay forever. It is a temporary arrangement that the trees and leaves have. The trees tell the leaves, "You are going to look really cool for like a few weeks. Then I'm going to have to let you go."

One of my best friends has a weird view on Fall. "I don't like fall, everything turns the color of decay."

We've had multiple conversations about it, but on a certain level he is not wrong. The leaves change color, fall to the ground to end up in a trash bag or mulched. Lots of things fall. Sometimes gas prices, more often the stock market. People in power, people in the Bible fall because of sin. Samson, King David, Judas.

However one thing that doesn't fall, something that doesn't change, is God's word and how much he loves us.

1 John 4:9-11 says:

"This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is Love: not that we loved God, but what he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear Friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another."

God's love is so great. God's love for us didn't start because we loved Him. Before we were born He knew that we needed to be saved from our sin and He provided a way. That's love. That's why we worship Him.

So I leave you with Romans 8:37-39:

"No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."
